




## SRH Serbia: Addressing Sexual & Gender Based Violence

Integrating rigorous study design for research publication and dissemination



### TBI RESULTS

Statistically, participants hold more egalitarian attitudes after TBI

Replicated in Albania, Bosnia & Herzegovina, Estonia, Latvia, Portugal and Romania



14,386 people reached through online discussions

Planning scale-up with 12 groups

### **OUR UNIQUE ROLE**

Gender is the first and foremost topic for SRH Serbia. We have done a cross-cutting analysis ensuring gender as a priority issue in all of our strategic documents and programmes. We help other NGOs also work on gender perspectives.

SRH Serbia has a rule of accountability to populations affected by its work. Women and the special populations we work with - Roma, refugees, LGBTIQ people, mandatory immigration returnees, youth with disabilities, people with HIV/AIDS and women in general – provide input into our messages, programme development and implementation.

Our work on gender is particularly helpful in working with refugees, because it helps introduce the full spectrum of SGBV and sexual and reproductive health and rights (SRHR) topics. Helping women feel ownership for their own bodies helps enable SRHR service outreach and provision.

# Using Theatre to address SGBV

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Engage with script writer and director with shared values to develop Theatre Based Education (TBE) also known as Theatre Based Learning (TBL)

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 Hold Theatre-based interventions (TBI) for young people, who enact scenarios including gender role reversal and SGBV

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The TBI is followed by guided, facilitated discussion addressing gender prejudice and SGBV

• Partner with national CSOs to both develop and later franchise the TBI for wider implementation

Make short films from material collected during performances as a basis for moderated online

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Measure quality and impact on perceptions of gender roles using theory-based, mixed participatory methods and formative evaluation



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
